I. Darkness

- Darkness has a way to make us uneasy
- Darkness can make our imaginations run wild
- Spiritual darkness is all around us

Reference: Genesis 3:14–15

II. Ways the Adversary Attacks Christians

- He's an accuser of Christians
(*Revelation 12:10*)
 - He wants to blind your mind
(*II Corinthians 4:4*)
 - He lies to us and tries to make us believe assumptions
(*John 8:44*)
 - He wants to wear us out
(*Daniel 7:25*)
 - The adversary wants to take rest and sleep from you
 - God created the body to grow while it is sleeping
 - Psalms 91 is a direct reference to the adversary wearing out saints. However, Psalms 91 shows us divine protection as a child of God

III. The Power of Night

Reference: Genesis 1:1–5

- The nighttime was the beginning of a new day
 - The Jewish day began at sunset
 - The new day is born at night
 - God does His greatest works in the darkest of nights

IV. Miracles at Night

- Crossing the Red Sea was done at night
 - At midnight Paul and Silas prayed
 - Peter was awakened from jail at night and set free
 - Jesus walked on water in the middle of the night
 - Gideon defeated the Midianite army at midnight
